

### Advice from a School Counselor

- Know that your child will be exhausted the first day and week of school!! If possible, try to have down time after school during this week.
- When in doubt, reach out! Connect with adults at school when you have a question or concern.
- Remember to notice and celebrate what your child is doing right! This will help nurture a strong relationship and make harder conversations and situations easier in the future.

### Advice from a Teacher

- **Use Schoology** to see what your student is learning about and see potential missing work!
- Get to know your student's Homeroom teacher they are a great contact!
- When your student is absent help them contact their core teachers!
- Give your student time to figure it out on their own before you step in.

### Advice from a Parent

- Look for ways to still have fun with your child!
- Meltdowns will happen. Try to remember how much change is happening in those middle school bodies and brains! Try to be patient and calm, and find humor when you can.
- Just be there and listen. Often that is all your child wants or needs. You don't have to fix things. Just be there. Just listen.

### Advice from an Administrator

- Talk to your child about the importance of regular school attendance.
- Routinely check in with your child about their social media usage, review and set boundaries.
- Middle School Age drama... it takes a village!


### What can my child do this summer to prepare?
